FLAG

The Italian flag is a tricolor of green, white, and red. It was first used in 1797 as the flag of the Cispadane Republic and was made the official flag of Italy in 1946.

The green stands for hope, the white for faith, and the red for charity. Together, the colors represent the unity of the Italian people.

The flag is one of the most recognizable symbols of Italy and is a sign of pride for Italians around the world.

Italy is a unitary parliamentary republic The government is a multi-party system, and the Prime Minister is the head of the government Legislative power is vested in the two houses of parliament, the Chamber of Deputies and the Senate

The President of Italy is the head of state and is elected for seven-year terms

The Prime Minister is appointed by the President and is responsible for selecting the

cabinet


Italy is a member of the European Union and the United Nations







CAPITAL CITY


The capital of Italy is Rome and is also the capital of Lazio region. It was proclaimed the capital of Italy on March 27,1871.

In Rome there are many important monuments such as: the Colosseum, the Roman Forum and St.Peter's Church.





OFFICIAL LANGUAGES



- Italy's official language is italian.
 - Modern Italian was born mostly with a novel called *Promessi Sposi* by Alessandro Manzoni, a very important italian writer.

 There is also an enormous variety of dialects: almost every region has its own dialect which is often incomprehensible if you don't live there!





LAND SIZE

Italy covers and area of 302,073 km2 and its a peninsula shaped like a boot that kicks a ball. It has twenty different regions and each one has its own culture and traditions.








MORPHOLOGY

- long peninsula resembling a boot
- divided into 20 regions, including the islands of Sicily and Sardinia
- about 40% of Italy's land is mountainous with the Alps and the Apennines
- the highest point in Italy is *Monte Bianco* (Mont Blanc) at 15,781 feet
- Mount Vesuvius is the only active volcano on the European mainland
- on the island of Sicily, Mount Etna, also still active, is one of the world's largest volcanoes





AVERAGE TEMPERATURE IN WINTER/SUMMER

- Mediterranean climate. Southern Italy has a hot and mostly dry climate while the north has more of an Alpine climate, getting lots of snow in winter
- in the summer, days get humid, especially in the cities => the perceived heat is higher than the actual temperature
- we will use 3 most representive cities of the North, the Centre and South from a climatic point of view and give you their own average temperatures

NATIONAL SYMBOL

- **4 elements**: a star, a gear wheel, an olive, and oak branches
- **olive branch** = the desire for peace in the nation
- **oak branch** = the strength of the Italian people
- steel gear wheel = reference to the 1st article of the Italian Constitution: "Italy is a democratic republic founded on work"





NATIONAL SPORT

Football is the most popular sport in Italy

- The **Italian national team** is considered to be one of the best national teams in the world
- won the FIFA World Cup four times (1934, 1938, 1982, 2006).
- two European Championships (1968 and 2020)
- the **Serie A** is one of the most popular professional sports leagues in the world
- the Italian National Team **did not qualify** for the FIFA World Cup in 2017
