SCHOOL

At Gymnasium Casimirianum Coburg I attend lessons with students from the 6th to the 12th grade. It is one of the few schools in this area where you must study Latin from the beginning.

It has three buildings and you can go through them by using the stairs or the little space outside. Students have to do a lot of subjects (more than in the Italian system) but there is the possibility to choose some of them (like Spanish, French or Italian).

At the end of the final grade they have to do written and oral exams but they can choose the ones in a foreign language.






TAKE A LOOK FROM INSIDE
